#### **Reminders:**

- We know that childhood illnesses can come on quickly and that all symptoms can be gone just as fast. To ensure that other children stay "healthy" we ask that you keep your child home, symptom-free, for at least 24 hours after becoming ill. We realize that a child can come down with an illness in the middle of the night and seem fine the next day, but please keep the home just to be safe. If your child is sent home ill from the center, they may not return the next day even if they are symptom-free. Please be sure to sign your child in and out daily. Our sign-in books are there not only for compliance with the state laws but also to keep track of all of the children in our care. It only takes a moment and we appreciate your help!
- Please have your child at school by 9:00 am. With the weather warming up we will start taking morning walks throughout March. If you or your child have appointments and will be arriving late, simply let your child teacher know the day prior. I understand that things come up unexpectedly, and in that case, please callthe center to let us know what time we can expect your child.
